It won't be long, and our Quilts Kingston 2018 Show will be history. *Why not help keep the Show alive by entering your quilt or quilted item(s) into the Kingston Fall Fair, Sept 13-16?* Your items would be entered in the Fair before 11 am on Thursday Sept 13. Yes, you are required to fill out forms, and special tags. I can get us these ahead of time. There are several of us who have gone through the process. We can help you if you want. All you have to do is ask!

We will once again have a booth in the clean and lighted Bennett Barn on Saturday and Sunday September 15, 16. In the fall I will be looking for people to take a 2-hour shift. It's lots of fun talking to the people and kids coming to the Fair. And it's an opportunity to meet other crafters: the embroiderers, the rug hookers, knitters, weavers and spinners. It's a different experience ... maybe outside your comfort zone, but hay – you'll just have had the experience of Quilts Kingston 2018! Please consider this over the summer. And you can even sell some quilted items and keep all the dollars.

Below are some of the categories you can enter. Be sure to keep threads & fabric to prove that it was you that made the item. (Believe it or not, some people purchase what



others have made and then enter it into the fair as their own. Takes all kinds!)

1. Quilt – pieced, quilted by hand by the exhibitor
2. Quilt – pieced, machine quilted by the exhibitor
3. Quilt – appliquéd, quilted by hand by the exhibitor
4. Quilt – appliqued, quilted by machine by the exhibitor
5. Quilt – whole cloth, quilting by hand by the exhibitor
6. Quilt –any quilted by longarm
7. Quilt –Group Quilt, quilted by hand
8. Crib Quilt
9. Art Quilt-perimeter
10. Memory Quilt
11. Miniature quilt more then 1 block max 60” (152.4 cm)
12. Quilted Wall Hanging
13. Quilt Top – unquilted
14. Quilted Placemats - set of 2 matching
15. Quilted table runner
16. Table topper
17. Quilt Blocks - 2 different patterns
18. Article of Quilting not mentioned above - hand or machine quilted by the exhibitor




